

We will spend the day in Albany on Tuesday, May 2nd, for a

rally and visits to legislators in support of the Humane Alternatives to Long-Term (HALT) Solitary

legislation is considered a model for the entire country, even people from outside the state are welcome

More than 15 days spent in Solitary Confinement has been defined as torture by the UN. Research shows that solitary confinement inflicts devastating trauma and hurts the progress of those re-entering society after incarceration, leading to higher recidivism rates. Studies have shown that staff assaults, inmate assaults, use-of force incidents and suicide attempts have all decreased when Solitary is reduced.
